

FILM LONDON

In 2024, FL has attracted such high-profile projects as "Fubar" for Netflix starring Arnold Schwarzenegger and Carrie-Anne Moss, and "Motorheads" for Prime Studios starring Ryan Phillippe.

London has also hosted 3 feature film productions (so far) in 2024, one of which featured 80% local crew and talent.

We estimate that film productions in 2024 have accounted for over 1500 hotel room-nights.

Film London's online database boasts 1800 users, 173 locations, 165 performers, 143 crew members, and 88 resources.


